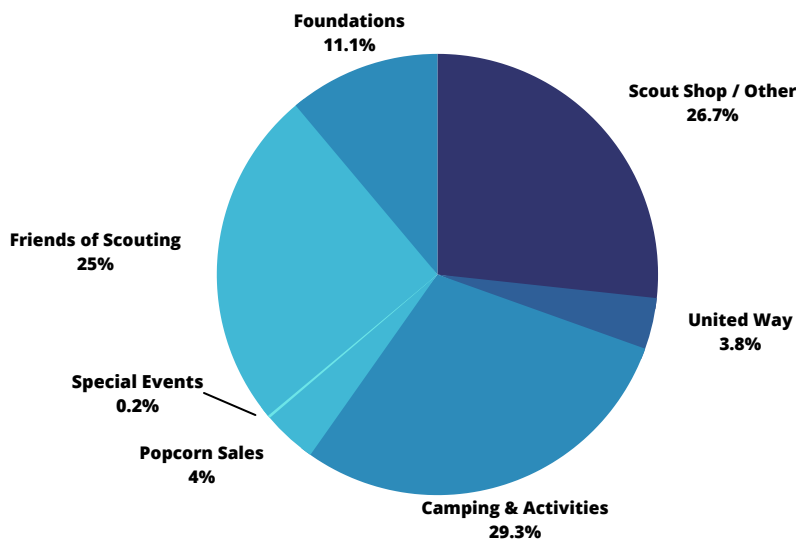

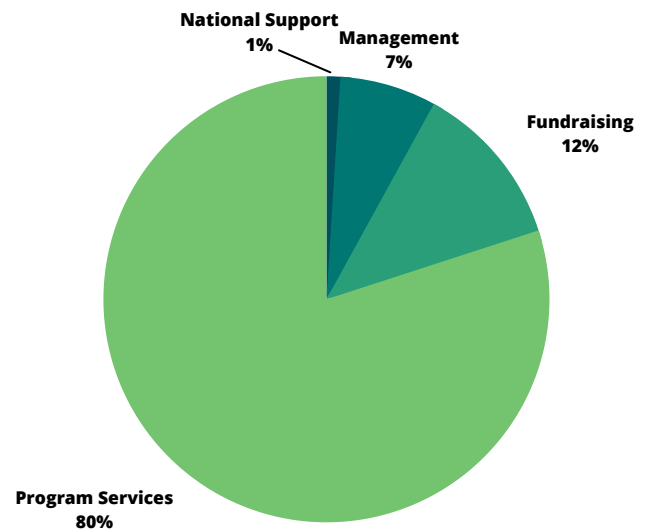

Over 300 Scouts and their families visited Camp Davy Crockett for Jamboree

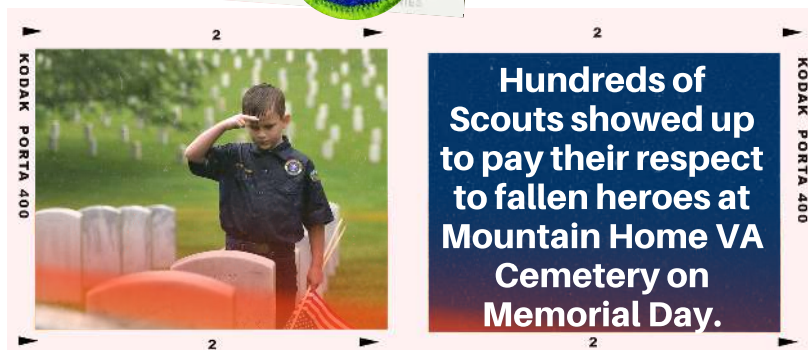
9,000+ Council Community Service hours.
