
The mission of the Boy Scouts of America is to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Law.

He has served in a multitude of different leadership positions in scouting including Scoutmaster of Troop 33, Advisor for Post 33, Council Explorer Chairman, and District Chairman of two districts, just to name a few. He has also served on Eagle Boards of Review for 27 years and on the Council Executive Board for 33 years.

Terry's numerous Scouting Achievements include the District Award of Merit, Silver Beaver, William H. Spurgeon, and William D. Boyce Awards.

He also contributed to youth outside scouting by having served 10 years as Sequoyah Council representative for the Alpha Phi Omega Chapter and 10 years as chapter counselor for Sigma Phi Epsilon both at ETSU.

Terry served 34 years as a member of the committee to place flags on graves for Johnson City Veterans Cemetery on Memorial Day. Hundreds of people show up at this event annually.
