DEAR FRIENDS OF THE SEQUOYAH COUNCIL:



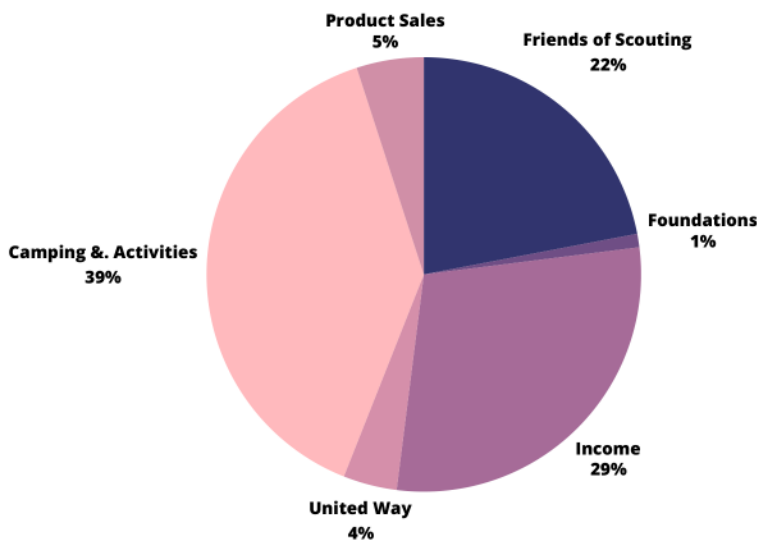

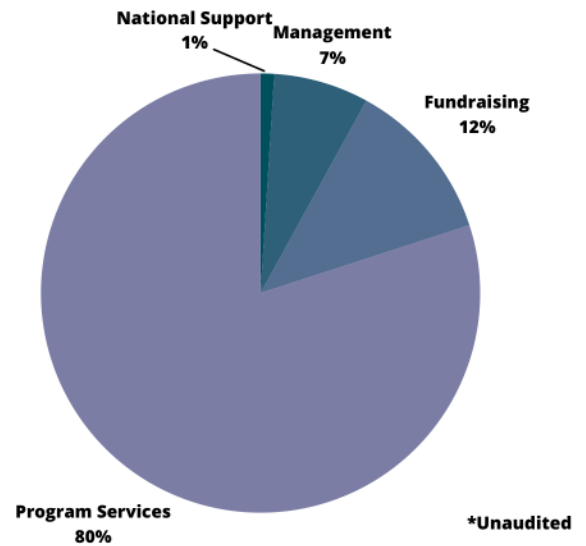
