Campers fired, shot, or launched over 70,500 projectiles throughout various programs including rifle, trebuchet, wrist rocket, shotgun, and archery.

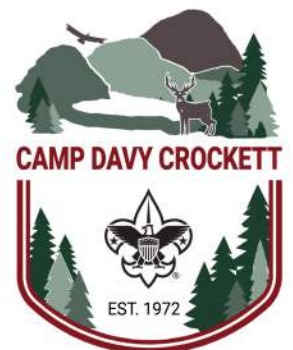

A program for young men and women designed to help young adults grow into responsible and caring adults through educational and recreational experiences.

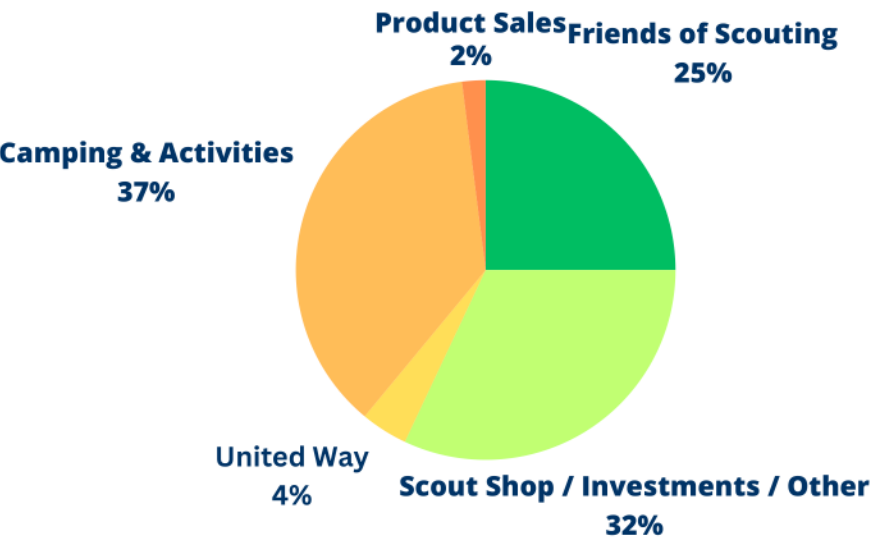
Scouts BSA (ages 11-18)

An outdoor program created to develop character, citizenship, and fitness in young men and women through gender specific units.

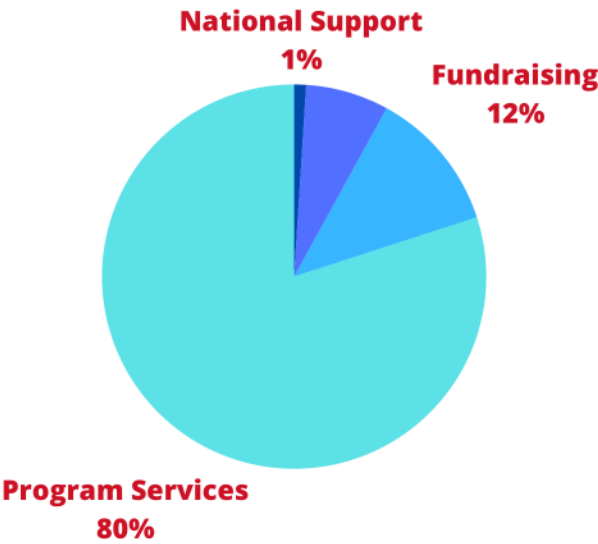
Exploring (ages 14-20)

A career education program for young men and women based on a unique and dynamic relationship between youth in the organizations in their communities who match their people and program interests of the youth.

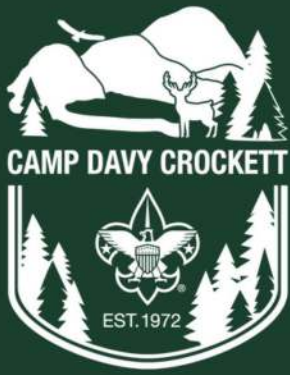
